1. Puppy Supplies:		
Puppy food (check with the breeder or rescue organization for the brand and type they have been feeding)		
Food and water bowls		
Collar and leash		
ID tag with your contact information		
Crate or puppy pen for confinement and training		
Bedding or a comfortable blanket		
Puppy-safe toys (chew toys, plush toys, interactive toys)		
Puppy potty training spray, pads or newspapers		
Poop bags for cleaning up after your puppy during walks

2. Grooming Supplies:		
It's best to avoid giving a bath to your puppy till 90 days old		
Puppy-friendly shampoo		
Dog brush or comb suitable for your puppy's coat type		
Nail clippers or a nail grinder for trimming nails		
Ear cleaning solution and cotton balls

3. Healthcare:		
Schedule an appointment with a veterinarian for a health checkup and vaccinations		
Obtain necessary medications, such as deworming and flea/tick control		
Consider pet insurance for potential future medical expenses

4. Puppy-Proofing Your Home:		
Remove any hazardous items or plants from your puppy's reach		
Secure electrical cords and cables		
Store household chemicals and medications out of reach		
Block off access to areas where the puppy shouldn't go

5. Training and Socialization:		
Research positive reinforcement training techniques		
Enroll in puppy training classes or seek the help of a professional trainer if needed		
Plan for regular socialization with other dogs and people in a safe and controlled environment
